For all of our vocational subjects it is advisable to have studied the subject at GCSE and secured a pass in Maths and English.



ENGLISH LITERATURE

About the course

English Literature invites you into powerful worlds of stories, voices, and ideas. You'll explore classic and contemporary texts, debate meanings, and develop interpretations. From Shakespeare to modern fiction, the course nurtures deep thought and discussion.

You will learn about:

- Pre-1900 poetry, modern novels and post-1900 poetry
- Shakespearean drama and modern plays
- Unseen prose and comparative literature analysis

You will develop skills in analysis, interpretation, essay writing, and critical thinking.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE

About the course

English Language is the study of how we communicate. You'll explore how children learn to speak, how language shapes identity, and how texts reflect culture. You'll also create your own original writing and conduct independent research.

You will learn about:

- Language and identity, dialects and sociolects
- Language change and child language development
- Media language and discourses
- Independent research on a language topic

You will develop skills in analysis, writing, research, and evaluation.

BIOLOGY

About the course

Biology explores life, from DNA to ecosystems. You'll investigate how the human body works, why species evolve, and how organisms interact. Lab work and field studies will bring theory to life.

You will learn about:

- Cells, DNA, proteins and genetics
- Human physiology and homeostasis
- Evolution, ecology, and biodiversity

You will develop skills in practical science, analysis, critical thinking, and investigation.

CHEMISTRY

About the course

Chemistry explains the matter that makes up our world. You'll study atoms, reactions, and materials in depth, using lab experiments to test your theories. It's a subject of discovery and transformation.

You will learn about:

- Thermodynamics, kinetics and equilibria
- Organic reactions and spectroscopy
- The periodic table and transition metals

You will develop skills in laboratory work, analysis, problem-solving, and reasoning.

PHYSICS

About the course

Physics asks the biggest questionswhat is matter, energy, and the universe? You'll explore how things move, how waves behave, and how electricity powers the world. You'll apply maths to real-world problems.

You will learn about:

- Mechanics, motion and materials
- Waves, quantum theory, and particles
- Electricity and magnetism

You will develop skills in modelling, analysis, experimentation, and logic.

MATHEMATICS

About the course

Mathematics helps make sense of the world. You'll develop fluency in numbers, functions and reasoning, applying these skills to real-world situations. Maths is essential for science, tech, and beyond.

You will learn about:

- Algebra, trigonometry and calculus
- Probability, statistics and data
- Mechanics and mathematical proof

You will develop skills in logic, problem-solving, data analysis, and modelling.

FURTHER MATHEMATICS

About the course

Further Maths goes deeper and broader than A-Level Maths. You'll tackle complex numbers, matrices, algorithms and more. It's ideal for those who love a challenge and want to stretch their mathematical ability.

You will learn about:

- Complex numbers and advanced algebra
- Graph theory and discrete mathematics
- Mechanics and statistics

You will develop skills in advanced reasoning, problem-solving, and mathematical thinking.

HISTORY

About the course

History tells the stories of the past to help us understand the present. You'll explore Tudor England, Nazi Germany and the British Empire, learning how power, culture and ideas shaped societies.

You will learn about:

- Tudor monarchy, power and religion
- The rise and fall of Nazi Germany
- The expansion and decline of the British Empire

You will develop skills in analysis, research, argument and interpretation.

GEOGRAPHY

About the course

Geography explores how humans and the planet interact. You'll examine climate systems, urban change, and global governance-and head out on fieldwork to see geography in action.

You will learn about:

- The carbon and water cycles
- Urban and global systems
- Human-environment interactions

You will develop skills in research, analysis, fieldwork and map interpretation.

MEDIA STUDIES

About the course

Media Studies explores how media shapes the way we see the world. You'll examine adverts, film, news, and digital platforms - and even create your own media products.

You will learn about:

- Media language, representation and audiences
- The media industry and digital platforms
- Practical media production

You will develop skills in analysis, creativity, production, and critical thinking.

IT

About the course

IT equips you with the digital skills every modern workplace needs. From coding to cybersecurity, you'll learn to solve real-world tech problems and design systems that work.

You will learn about:

- Hardware, software and IT systems
- Application design and cyber security
- Data handling and global information

You will develop skills in digital literacy, project work, and technical problemsolving.

BUSINESS AND DOUBLE BUSINESS

About the course

Business explores how organisations work and succeed. You'll learn about finance, marketing, and management through hands-on projects and real-world examples.

You will learn about:

- Business environments and markets
- Finance, budgeting and accounts

Sociology investigates how society works. You'll explore identity, power, culture, and inequality - examining how families, education, and crime shape our lives.

You will learn about:

- Education, families, crime and religion
- Inequality, identity and social change
- Sociological theories including Marxism and feminism

You will develop skills in debate, research, evaluation, and analysis.

HEALTH & SOCIAL CARE

About the course

Health and Social Care prepares you to support others. You'll explore how people grow and change, and how to meet their needs with compassion and professionalism.

You will learn about:

- Human development and care needs
- Roles and responsibilities in health and care
- Ethics, care planning and health conditions

You will develop skills in empathy, communication, care planning, and professionalism.

FINE ART

About the course

Fine Art is all about creativity and visual expression. You'll explore a range of techniques, media, and ideas, developing your own unique artistic style.

You will learn about:

- Drawing, painting and sculpture
- Mixed media and digital art
- Art theory and critical reflection

You will develop skills in creativity, technique, critical thinking, and personal expression.

PHOTOGRAPHY

About the course

Photography captures how we see the world. You'll learn how to shoot, edit and present visual stories, developing both creative and technical expertise.

You will learn about:

- Camera techniques and visual composition
- Digital editing and image manipulation
- Personal and themed projects

You will develop skills in technical photography, creativity, editing and storytelling.

About the course


Drama brings performance to life. You'll act, direct and explore theatre, gaining confidence and creativity through both practical and theoretical work.


