# YEAR GROUP NEWS

## Short Term, Big Achievements

### Reception

This term, Reception have been very busy learning about minibeasts and how things grow. We started off the term with our visit to Stover Country Park where the children had the chance to do pond dipping and look for minibeasts in the woods.

The children were also very excited to receive some caterpillars! We have thoroughly enjoyed watching them grow - they are currently in their cocoons waiting to emerge to be butterflies. The children also loved meeting 'Bill the gardener', who brought us some runner beans to plant. We can't wait to see if our beans grow! Reception have had such a fantastic term, full of fun and excitement!



### Pre-School

It has been a busy and exciting term for the Pre-School children as they fully embraced our topic, 'What Can I Grow?' They loved exploring the stories Jack and the Beanstalk, The Enormous Turnip and The Growing Story, through a range of fun and engaging activities. A special visit from Jill, 'Jack's best friend', brought Jack and the Beanstalk to life through interactive storytelling and role play, which the children thoroughly enjoyed.

They also planted seeds, learned what plants need to grow and explored creative vegetable printing inspired by The Enormous Turnip. We especially enjoyed looking at photographs of the children as babies and discussing how they have grown and changed. We look forward to our new topic, 'What is in the Woods?', our Sports Day and the Pre-School Graduation.



### Nursery

This term, the children have loved learning through our topic rhyme, 'Row, Row, Row Your Boat' They enjoyed exploring boats in blue gloop, creating their own paper plate boats, fork painting polar bears and brushing the crocodile's teeth.

We also shared lots of learning linked to our topic book, 'Row Your Boat'. The children have collaged a large boat and tree, discovered hidden spiders in the sand tray, used feathers to paint colourful parrots and jumped like bunnies over hurdles. They thoroughly enjoyed taking Rhyme Time outside to make learning fun in the sun.

It has been a busy term with lots of fantastic learning and welcoming lots of new children to Turtle Class; lots of new friendships have been formed.



## Year 1

Year 1 have had a fantastic term and have worked incredibly hard across all subjects. In Maths, the children did a great job learning about multiplication and practised counting confidently in 2s, 5s and 10s. In English, they enjoyed studying the books 'Stuck' by Oliver Jeffers and 'I Love Bugs' by Emma Dodd, using these texts to inspire their own creative writing.

In History, the children loved learning about 'Significant Sports Stars'. They compared the Ancient Olympics with the modern Olympics and learned about the achievements of Jesse Owens and Ellie Simmonds, discussing how sports technology has changed over time. The children finished the topic with excellent end-of-unit writes that demonstrated brilliant knowledge and understanding. We are looking forward to an excellent Term 6!



## Year 3

Year 3 have had a fantastic Term 5 filled with exciting learning across the curriculum. This term, the children explored the fascinating topic of Ancient Greece and enjoyed celebrating their learning with their very own Ancient Greek Day to finish the term. In Computing, the children planned, created and evaluated their own animations, developing their creativity and digital skills. In Science, the children used Newton Meters to investigate different forces and explored how magnets attract and repel. In RE, the children took their learning outside of the classroom and visited St Budeaux Parish Church to expand their understanding of the Easter Story.

We are incredibly proud of the hard work, determination and resilience shown by Year 3 throughout the term and we cannot wait to begin our exciting Term 6 learning!



## Year 2

Year 2 have had a fantastic term full of exciting learning experiences. In History, the children explored World War II, learning about key events, life during the war and how Plymouth was affected. They finished the topic with a wonderful VE Day street party celebration. In Science, the children became young gardeners by planting their own sunflower seeds and observing them germinate and grow while learning what plants need to stay healthy. In English, they enjoyed studying a range of engaging texts and were thrilled to welcome illustrator Alex Patrick for a special visit.

In Art, the children developed their drawing and mark-making skills to create World War II themed artwork, while in Computing they created quizzes using ScratchJr. Year 2 have shown enthusiasm, curiosity and creativity throughout the term and we are incredibly proud of all they have achieved. Thank you for your continued support.



**Year 4**

It has been another fantastic term of learning in Year 4! The children's History topic, 'Vikings', led to great exploration of how the Vikings lived and discovered the wider world. 'Viking Day' was a fantastic success and lovely to see the children finding their inner Vikings! They finalised their learning by creating news reports about the Viking attack on Lindisfarne.

In Maths, in preparation for their statutory Multiplication Tables Check in June, the children spent the month practising their times tables. In English, they explored the text, 'Book of Bones', and created their own mystery text about an animal. In Computing, the children designed and created their own Scratch games, adding in repetitions and sounds. In Science, Year 4 have learnt about adaptations animals have made to survive in different environments.

In Art, the children created compositions using various painting techniques. They've created some fantastic final paintings which we were able to display at the Year 4 Art Exhibition! We're so proud of the children's hard work this term and can't wait to see what the final term brings!



**Year 5**

Year 5 have had a great term of learning and should be very proud of all they have achieved. In Art, the children explored architecture and took inspiration from the visual artist, Friedensreich Hundertwasser, to create their own drawings of a Plymouth monument of their choice. In English, the children wrote detailed non-chronological reports about an animal's life cycle, demonstrating excellent research and writing skills.

In Science, they learned about humans and animals over time, including evolution and fossils, and explored how living things adapt and change. In History, the children enjoyed learning about the history of Plymouth and produced wonderful guide leaflets about the city. Well done, Year 5, on a fantastic term of learning. We are excited for the final term of the academic year!



**Year 6**

Year 6 have had another brilliant term and we are incredibly proud of everything they have achieved. The children showed outstanding resilience, determination and effort during their SATs week, remaining focused, positive and working extremely hard throughout - we know they will all have done well! Beyond SATs, the children continued to apply themselves across the wider curriculum.

In Whole Class Reading, they demonstrated great maturity when discussing the themes and topics covered in their class text, 'The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas', making thoughtful links to their History learning about Twentieth Century Conflict.

The children have continued to impress us with their hard work, attitude to learning and support for one another throughout the term. Well done, Year 6, on a fantastic term – we are looking forward to an exciting final term together before the transition to secondary school.

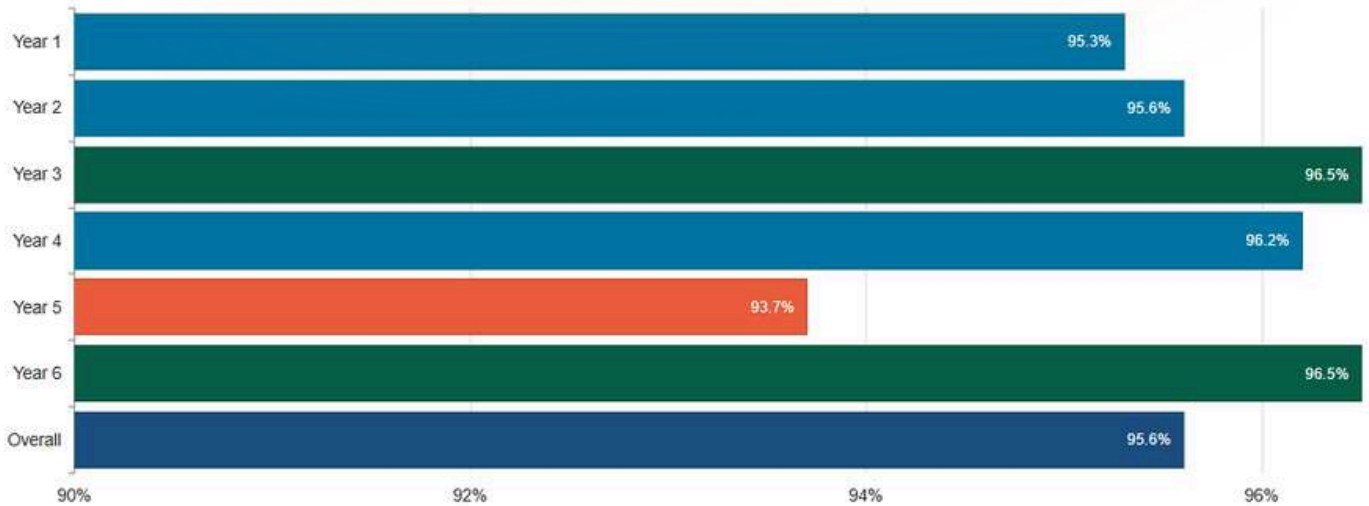

## ROBLOX UPDATE



### What is Roblox?

Roblox is a platform consisting of a collection of games.

Players can either create games or play games that other users have created. As a lot of the content is user generated, not all games will be suitable for your child to view/play. If your child is playing Roblox, it is important to monitor what your child is accessing as well as set up appropriate parental controls. PEGI rate Roblox with a Parental Guidance recommended label, this is because it is a platform of individual, user generated games.

### New Age-Based Accounts

From next month, Roblox will introduce two new age-based accounts: Roblox Kids for users ages 5 to 8 and Roblox Select for users ages 9 to 15.

Roblox Kids Accounts (ages 5–8) will be limited to games with a 'Minimal or Mild' content maturity label and all communication is disabled by default.

Roblox Select accounts (ages 9 to 15) will be limited to games with content maturity labels up to and including 'Moderate'.

By default, Experience Chat is ON and Direct Experience Chat is OFF.

### Parental Controls

As part of parental controls, you can manage content ratings, communication, screen-time and spending limits, as well as see which games your child is playing on and who their friends are.

#### Roblox are extending these controls to allow you to:

- Block specific individual games (to age 15).
- Manage direct chat settings (to age 15).
- Approve access to specific games. It is important to regularly monitor what your child is playing on Roblox and who they are interacting with, even if you have parental controls set up.

## GROUP CHATS



### Is your child part of any group chats?

This could be on social media, for example on WhatsApp or within games such as Fortnite.

If so, it is important that you are aware of the potential risks:

**Inappropriate content** – there is often a lack of moderation within chat facilities so users could be exposed to content/language that is not suitable for their age.

**Bullying** – there are many instances where inappropriate/hurtful comments are shared within groups, this could take the form of name calling or body shaming. Bullying can also be in the form of excluding others from the group. These issues often overspill into 'real life'.

**Strangers** – your child could be added to groups with people they do not know or even with someone that they have previously blocked.

**Conversations can be shared/screenshot** – make sure your child is aware that anything they share within a group can be shared with others.

**Sharing personal information** – remind your child to be aware of the information they share with others, including images and location.

### How can I help make group chats safer?

- Check the recommended age rating and adhere to them.
- Set up age-appropriate parental controls, suitable privacy settings and set screen time limits.
- On WhatsApp you can do a privacy check, by going to settings, privacy and privacy checkup.
- Show your child how to use any reporting and blocking tools.

### What else can I do?

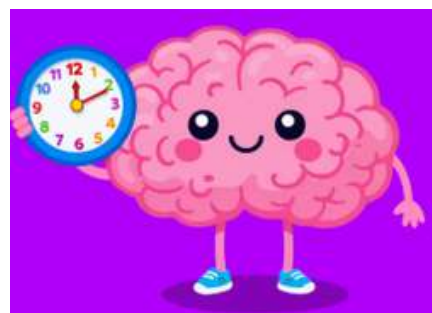
- It is crucial to have regular conversations with your child about the risks outlined above and about what they are doing online.
- Talk about who they are chatting with, encourage them to think carefully about what they send and how it could be perceived by others.

## Screen time guidance for under 5s

The Government now advise limiting screen time for young children. They advise avoiding screen time for under 2 years and to try to keep it to less than 1 hour a day for 2-5 years. Best Start for Life have published an article outlining what content is better, how your own screentime affects your child and how screentime can affect your child's development.

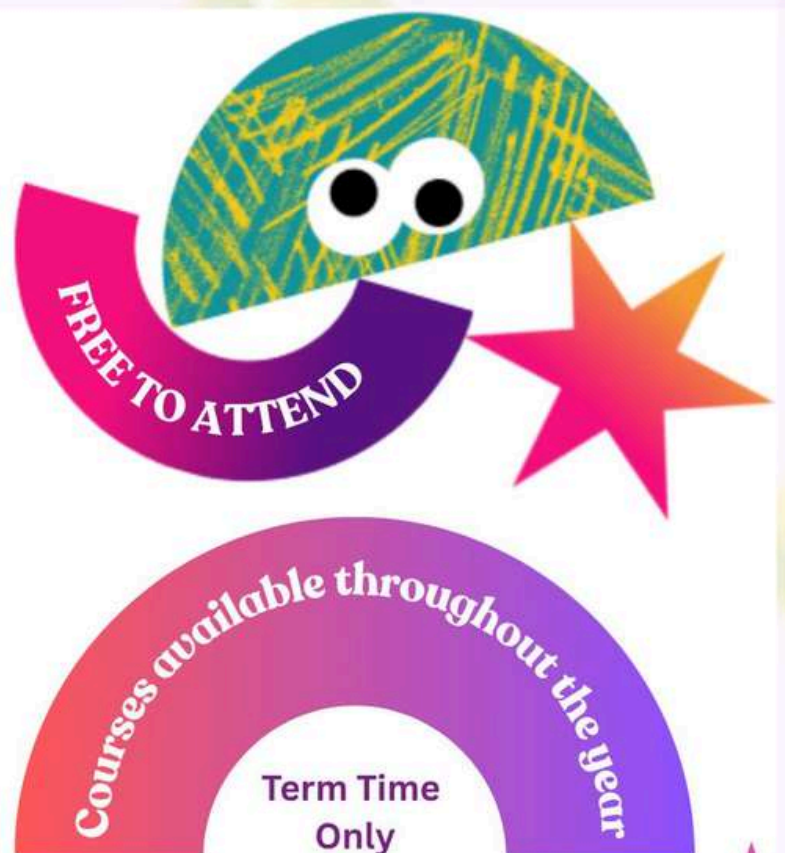
