### YEAR GROUP NEWS Creativity, curiosity and community

### Reception

As the weather is now warmer and spring has sprung, both Reception classes have enjoyed exploring the school grounds and as part of Science Day, the children enjoyed meeting the MAP animals. We had a chance to cuddle the guinea pigs and checked up on the rabbits. The children have really enjoyed learning about our new topic 'Changes' and have loved reading our new topic book, 'Tad'. We have been keeping an eye on Reception's pond outside to check on the frogspawn and we were excited to find tadpoles in our pond. We have spent time using magnifying glasses to check on their progress and can't wait to see what happens next! We loved having parents and carers come in to class to watch our Phonics lessons and to share some stories. We hope you all enjoyed it too!





### **Pre-School**

It has been an exciting start to the new term in Pre-School; we have welcomed new children into our classes who have settled beautifully and are great members of our pre-school team. We have enjoyed meeting 'Silly Sally' who was a friend of 'Jack and the Beanstalk' who treated us to an interactive Jack and the Beanstalk story session. The children had the opportunity to find magic beans, steal a golden hen and even cut down the giant's beanstalk. We are looking forward to growing our own 'magic beans' and learning all about the changes that have happened to us since we were babies. ### Nursery

This term, we have welcomed everyone back after the Easter holidays into Turtle Class, including some new friends. It has been wonderful to meet everyone and watch the children build some new friendships. The children have been excited to begin our new topic 'Row, Row, Row your Boat', where they have been enjoying learning the rhyme. They have also enjoyed sailing boats with their friends in the water tray, making paper plate boats, created a collage tree and discovered spiders in the sand tray. We have also been celebrating World Space Day, where the children have explored a spacethemed tuff tray and created their own planets using neon paints.





### Year 1

The children in Year 1 had another busy month in April! The children enjoyed taking part in British Science Day. They watched an assembly from 'Fizz, Pop Science' where they observed lots of exciting experiments with some of the children even joining in. In the classroom, the children have continued to work hard in preparation for the Phonics Screening Check in June. They have been reviewing previously learnt sounds and tricky words. The children rounded off their excellent Geography learning by answering questions in their books about Plymouth and the wider area. It has been great to see the progress the children have been continuing to make in their learning over the past month. The children as a whole are becoming more independent in preparation for Year 2.



#### Year 2

In April, Year 2 have been diving into World War Two, with a particular focus on Britain and Plymouth's role during this period. The children are thoroughly enjoying discovering new facts! In English, we are exploring the book From Seed to Flower and learning how to write instructions. This ties in with our Science topic on plants, where we've been learning about their growth and needs. We were lucky to have Mrs. King visit and teach the children about gardening. They were excited to ask her questions and even got to plant their own sunflowers!

In Maths, we've been learning about fractions and key terms like numerator and denominator. In Art, we started experimenting with charcoal for markmaking. We can't wait to see how the term unfolds, especially our sunflowers' progress!





### Year 3

The children in Year 3 finished Term 4 by drafting and writing high quality Geography essays, showing all their excellent learning from their topic 'Villages, Towns and Cities'. In English, the children wrote their own stories inspired by the book 'Blue John', using a wide range of writing skills including adjectives and similes. Before Easter, the children enjoyed finishing their Whole-Class Reading book, 'Varjak Paw' and this term, have dived into their new text 'Operation Gadgetman'.

In Science, the children have been introduced to their new topic, 'Forces', and have explored different types of contact and non-contact forces. We absolutely loved the fantastic effort the children put into their Science Home Learning over the Easter break! Well done!

In History, the children have started their new and exciting learning on Ancient Greeks. We are also really looking forward to having our Ancient Greece themed day later in the term, where children will be invited to dress up. A letter has been sent out with more information on this. Keep up the great work, Year 3!



#### Year 4

have had Year 4 another productive month of learning, with more outstanding progress. In Maths, the children have gained a strong understanding of fractions and decimals and can now order hundredths. tenths and The children are now practising their times tables ready for the MTC in June and have enjoyed learning the times tables songs! In English, the children have been learning about record breaking animals, in their non-fiction text 'Book of Bones' which they will base their nonfiction writing on this term. In Science, the children have learnt about how animals and plants adapt depending their on environments. In History, the children's learning for the History topic, 'Vikings', has been broad. The children have learnt about Viking life, the Lindisfarne raid in 793CE and they have studied a timeline for the period, where they have made links to their previous 'Anglo-Saxons' and 'Roman Britain' topics. In Computing, the children have been investigating repetition in games and have programmed their own games. Well done to all Year 4 children for their resilience and creativity in another busy month!



#### Year 5

Year 5 have made an excellent start to the Summer Term. They have started their new topic, 'Plymouth, A City of Voyage and Discovery', by learning about Plymouth's geographical location in the world, recognising the development of Plymouth from small settlement to city and its importance as a centre for trade in Tudor times. To support this topic, the children have been focusing on historical buildings in Plymouth and replicating them in their Art.

In Computing, Year 5 have revisited previous learning on 'selection' and identified how 'conditions' are used to control the flow of actions in a program. They have also been introduced to the blocks for using conditions in programs using the Scratch programming environment. In Maths, the children have used their fractions knowledge to convert between fractions, decimals and percentages. Well done Year 5!



### Year 6

This month, Year 6 have had a tremendous start to Term 5. In Maths, the children have mastered how to calculate angles in various 2-D shapes. In English, they have been focusing on the features of a newspaper article, ready to write their own, focusing on their previous descriptive writing final write.

In Science, they have been understanding how heat affects the properties of an object. In History, we have unpicked the reasons that led to the start of World War II and debated whether it was appropriate to not include Germany in the discussions for the Treaty of Versailles. In DT they designed, measured, cut and sewed their own pencil cases. We have really enjoyed seeing them throw themselves into rounders and love the resilience they are continuing to show towards their upcoming SATs assessments.

We are fortunate to have an incredible Outdoor Area. With the nicer weather our After School Club is often outside but they are not able to do this until all families

have left the area. Please can we ask that children and families do not stay and play in the Outdoor Area. including the grass and trim trail. after school.

Our Academy Parliament reps were thrilled to receive a letter from the House of Commons and even more excited to find personal letters from Fred Thomas MP addressed to each of them! A huge thank you to Fred Thomas for taking the time to respond, for listening to the children's campaign and for showing his support. He's committed to working with us to enforce the no right turn policy and make our streets safer for pupils and parents.


much to our young scientists! And a huge thank you to Mrs Impey for organising the whole event!

### TALK PANTS WITH THE NSPCC

Talk PANTS was developed to help you have conversations with your child to help them understand that their body belongs to them.

Some examples of times you can talk PANTS are:

- After school if they've had a lesson on personal relationships or Talk PANTS at school, ask them what they remember when they get home.
- Bathtime you could start a conversation when you're running your child's bath, or helping them get dressed.
- Car journeys this can be a great time to talk, and your child will have plenty of time to ask questions if they need.
- Singing sing along to our PANTS song with Pantosaurus!
- Swimming a great time to say that what's covered by swimwear is private.
- Walking walking home from school, or a weekend walk to the shops can help you both feel more at ease as you stroll and chat.
- Watching TV if a TV show features a sensitive storyline, you can encourage them to talk about anything that upsets them.



### BRAND ARMY

We have been made aware of a concerning new app called Brand Army' that is being described as the junior equivalent to Only Fans'. The app allows young people to upload content but subscribers have to be over 18. This is deeply concerning so please be vigilant in ensuring that your child does not access this app on their devices.

What Parents Should Know:

Children as young as 13 can join with parental permission, but adults are the ones who can view and pay for their content.

The platform allows "implied" adult content, which may include suggestive poses or attire. There are reports of users requesting outfits or gifts, which may expose minors to unwanted or unsafe adult attention.






### Screen time and healthy balance

Screen time is classed as any time spent in front of a screen, so it includes everything from watching tv to completing homework on a laptop. Whilst there is no recommended screen time (except for under two, which is zero), it is important that we find a balance. Screen time can obviously be beneficial, both for educational and entertainment purposes, however it is important to be aware of the risks including:

-Eye strain

-Disrupted sleep

-Less time for other activities and being outdoors -Affects our attention span.


